From Pastor



Time does that thing that it always does... it marches on. And when time does the thing, it always does, we are always surprised at the speed of which time moves. Time either moves too slowly or too fast for our liking. We are often surprised at the passing of time. We have all said things like, "I can't believe summer is over!" "How can it already be November?" "How is it possible I'm 50 years old?!?!". Still... Time marches on, and we are almost always caught off guard and surprised by the passing of time.

In moments of surprise, that is when we discover the astonishment of God's work and God's purposes. When it comes to God, surprise is a matter of perspective. Few of the characters in the gospels really knew or understood God's trajectory, but they should have. The message was clearly telegraphed: God will save God's people. Even if God's choice of incarnation was surprising, it was still well within the character of God as attested by the ancient Hebrew prophets. God had been sending the messages for quite some time that things would happen just so, yet God still managed to surprise.

As time marches on, we find ourselves on the cusp of the Advent season. A time of expectation. In addition to expectation, we may also experience feelings of astonishment, amazement, bewilderment, excitement, and thrill that come with the life of faith. Such feelings may accompany a new direction, a rediscovery of purpose, or an eye-opening epiphany. Surprise can be bright and loud, but it can be quiet, too. A different sense of astonishment accompanies us when we discover that God's goodness has draped itself in muted clothes and quietly worked behind the scenes of our lives.

As time marches on, and we somehow find ourselves once again facing winter and Christmas season, regardless of the speed of time, try to stay present in the moment. When we're present, we're open to Christ with us – in the silence and chaos, in the grief and joy, in the darkness and in the light.

God is with us in the passing of time, in the change of seasons, in the familiar and in the unexpected. We may not be ready for the seasons to change or for time to pass, but God is faithful and is with us in all of it. And as we approach Advent, my hope is you enter in the season with awe and excitement, and grateful for the time which has been given to you.

Lutheran World Relief Ingathering and Dedication 1st Sunday in October, 2025



Quilters meet at St. Luke Lutheran Church under the leadership of Anna Mae Grubb on the second Wednesday of each month to sew the layers of each quilt together by hand. This year the quilters created 106 quilts for Lutheran World Relief. Thank you to Anna Mae Grubb, Sue Hettinger and Karen Stump for helping to put the quilts together each month. Thank you to Sandy Smith who makes most of the quilt tops and to Andrea McAllister, Carol Lebo and Karen who also make quilt tops. Sandy and Karen do all the binding. Anna Mae does everything from sewing together donated sheets for the quilt bottoms, to patching together pieces of batting to soften the layers and provide warmth and comfort, collecting fabric used in sewing the quilt tops, and keeping everything for this process organized.

Millie H. Benfer, a woman who makes draperies, donated bolts and boxes of quilting materials this past year. Anna Ruth Burkholder had provided us with fabric for quilt tops and sheets for the quilt backs for many years, and she is no longer doing this. If you have sheets which are in good condition to donate, or are a thrift store shopper and purchase sheets which you wish to donate, it would be greatly appreciated. Any size sheet, flat or fitted, will work. We also use flannel sheets, but polyester sheets cannot be used because they will stretch. Thank you, St. Luke Lutheran congregation for your donations to WELCA for the purchase of quilt batting and your donations to Lutheran World Relief to help cover the \$2.80 cost to ship each quilt.

On Friday, October 10th, and Saturday, October 11th, Sue DeLong coordinated the collection from 15 congregations in the Lebanon County Conference for Lutheran World Relief and secured the truck and driver to transport the quilts and kits. Thank you to the following people who lifted and carried 40 lb. boxes from curbs to truck on Friday and then from truck to an 18-wheeler on Saturday: Mike DeLong, Sue DeLong, Sharon Reber, Mike Reber, Judy Plummer, Roger Bucy, Karen Stump, Faith Thunberg, Lyndon Bennetch, Heidi Eck, Melanie Bennetch, Andrea McAllister and Scott Reed. They carried a total of 380 quilts, 529 Personal Care Kits, 12 Fabric Kits and 1,064 School Kits each day.

A special thank you to **Woodmasters Cabinetry, Jason Sheaves**, and their volunteer driver, Brad Manwiller. He drove from St. Luke, Schaefferstown to St. Marks, Annville to Salem Lutheran, Lebanon and then the next day to Bergstrasse, Ephrata. Members of Bergstrasse Evangelical Lutheran Church transported the boxes on Sunday to a Minnosota Lutheran World Relief warehouse to be distributed worldwide.
