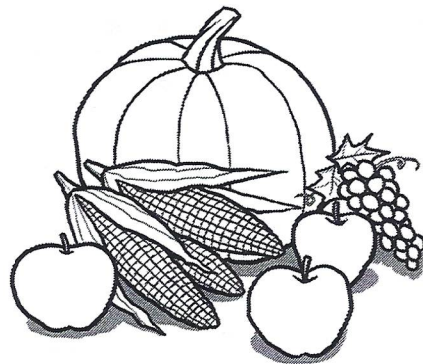

Meditative Singing with Communion: Eat this Bread

The elements of wafer and wine on the table before the Altar are an extension of St. Luke Congregation's morning Altar Feast and is available to this Taizé gathering.

Everyone is welcome to come to the table and take a wafer, dip it in the wine, and eat it while thankfully and mindfully remembering that in the bread and wine is Christ, given for you for the forgiveness of sin. Thank you Lord Jesus!

After receiving Christ, feel free to move to the side of the altar rail for prayer.

Eat this bread, drink this cup, come to him and nev - er be hun - gry.
