From our Pastor:

"For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope." Jeremiah 29:11

I think when a new year begins, we say things like "Wow! Where did this year go?". Or maybe something like, "I'm ready for this new beginning!" We sometimes are eager and more than ready to say goodbye to the past year, and with a newfound enthusiasm and energy are ready to greet the new year. It's a clean slate. A new beginning. The past is the past.

So, what will be different for you once January 1, 2023 rolls around? What changes are you committed to making? How will your life be different? What plans do you have to better your life, your community? Maybe you're going into 2023 with high goals and expectations. Maybe you're rolling into the new year with anxiety and fear, taking one day at a time.

"For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope." Jeremiah 29:11

Jeremiah 29:11 has nothing to do with any person living today. This verse applied only to the Jews who were in exile in Babylon during the sixth century BC. However, the sentiment expressed is so beautiful and encouraging, I think that there is meaning and practical use for us today.

This verse reflects God's grace and affections for those whom God loves. Because of the unchanging nature of God, God had promised to bring Israel back; therefore, the exiles could be assured that they had a future and a hope. Likewise, God has promised those who are in Christ, our sins are forgiven, and we stand before God justified. God has plans for those in Christ, and those plans are good.

We, as disciples, have plans for the church, plans for the future. We work towards those plans in faith that Christ is working within and around us, leading us, guiding us in our actions. We won't always get it right. We will fall short. We may disappoint each other, even ourselves along the way, but the promise of the Christ child is this: Emmanuel. God with us.

In Christ, we can be confident that all things will work together for our good and that God has a future planned for us. We have hope that "does not put us to shame" (Romans 5:5). We have been given promises to rely on, just as Israel was.

None of us know what will happen this year. No matter if we experience profound joy or grief, no matter if we meet or goals or fall short, no matter our level of excitement or dread, God has a plan for you. Plans that hold your wellbeing in a sacred and loved space. No matter how you enter this new year, know with confidence that God is with you.


BAND TOGETHER
