Confession and Forgiveness:

P: Blessed be the holy Trinity, + one God, in whose image we are made, who claims us and calls us beloved. C: Amen.

P: Holy One,

*Litany Hymn: LBW #174 "For All the Saints" (vv. 1 & 2)

*Litany for All Saints:

P: Blessed are the dead who die in Christ from henceforth, that they may rest from their labors, for their works shall follow them. Let us not be ignorant, friends, concerning those who fall asleep.

C: That we grieve not as those who have no hope; For if we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, those who have fallen asleep in Jesus, God will receive.

P: But someone will say, "How are the dead raised?" and "In what manner of body do they come?"

C: That which we sow is not the body that shall be, but a bare grain. But God gives it a body even as it pleases him, and to each seed a body of its own. It is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory.

P: It is sown a natural body, it is raised a spiritual body. For this corruptible must put on incorruption, and this mortal must put on immortality;

C: For if the earthly house of our tabernacle be dissolved, we have a building from God, a house not made with human hands, eternal in the heavens.

P: Jesus says to all the saints of all ages, "In God's house are many rooms...and I go to prepare a place for you."

P: Members of our congregation and others who have died since last All Saints Sunday have also heard his voice telling them:

"I have prepared a place for you"...

P: There are other friends and family who we know have died this year, whom we now mention in voice or heart (names) and Jesus has said to them, "I have prepared a place for you."

C: And Jesus says to each one of us, "I am preparing a place for you. I will not leave you desolate, I will come to you."

P: Jesus says, "The Comforter, the Holy Spirit, shall teach you all things, and bring to you remembrance of all that I have said to you."

C: Jesus says, "Peace I leave with you. My peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. So, do not let your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid."

P: Jesus says, "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, though they be dead, shall yet be alive. And whoever believes in me shall never die."

C: God created all people to be immortal, and made us in his divine eternal image. P: The lives of the righteous are in the hands of God, from which no evil can tear them away. They are in peace and their hope is full of immortality.

C: For God has tested them, and found them made worthy by his Son, who is Jesus: the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Amen.

and strengthen us to run the race set before us,

that we may delight in your mercy and rejoice with them in glory.

And so, with all the saints,

with the choirs of angels and all the hosts of heaven, we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

*Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy)



*Eucharistic Prayer:

P: You are indeed holy, almighty and merciful God. You are most holy, and great is the majesty of your glory.

You so loved the world that you gave your only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but have eternal life.

We give you thanks for his coming into the world to fulfill for us your holy will and to accomplish all things for our salvation.

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying:

Take and eat; this is my body, given for you.

Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

For as often as we eat of this bread and drink from this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

C: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

P: Remembering, therefore, his salutary command, his life-giving passion and death, his glorious resurrection and ascension, and the promise of his coming again, we give thanks to you, O Lord God Almighty, not as we ought but as we are able; we ask you mercifully to accept our praise and thanksgiving and with your Word and Holy Spirit to bless us, your servants. and these your own gifts of bread and wine, so that we and all who share in the body and blood of Christ may be filled with heavenly blessing and grace, and, receiving the forgiveness of sin, may be formed to live as your holy people and be given our inheritance with all your saints. To you, O God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory in your holy church, now and forever. C: Amen.

P: Lord, remember us in your kingdom and teach us to pray:

C: Our Father, who art in heaven hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread;

and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil.

For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory,

forever and ever. Amen




