P: Make us ready for this season of celebration,

C: that we may receive you with the same generous hospitality of the Emmaus travelers, and serve you forever as the messengers of your gifts of grace to the hearts and lives of others. Amen.

*Lighting the Advent Candles:

Today we light the second Advent candle, the Bethlehem candle. This candle is offered in honor of the birthplace of Jesus as well as of the many places where Christ is born in the hearts of believers. While Bethlehem was so busy with commerce that it had only a stable to offer Jesus, may our Bethlehems be places of warmth and hospitality. In honor of Bethlehem we light this candle. (Lighting of the candles)

P: Let us pray. We praise you, O God for this circle of light that marks our days of preparation for Christs advent. As we light the candles on this wreath kindle within us the fire of your spirit, that we may be light shining in the darkness.

Sung Response: Light two candles to watch for Messiah, let the light banish darkness. He shall feed the flock like a shepherd, Gently lead them homeward.
