Actually correction.


We ARE shining like the sun.






## Summer Happenings

As the relationship between St Luke's food ministry and Penryn's food ministry continues to grow and connect, we want to share some exciting volunteer opportunities with you.

Before I share those opportunities, I would like to present a brief recap of the history of Penryn's food ministry. As I reflected on the growth of Penryn's food ministry, it reminded me of one of Pastor Angie's recent sermons.

Penryn's food ministry began during COVID, when a member of the congregation approached Pastor Angie. The member of the congregation was concerned that people must be struggling and maybe the church could help. From this concern grew a small wooden box that sat on the side of the road and was filled with food for those in need. Although it seems like the time of no toilet paper, learning when to wear masks and how to social distance feels like a decade ago, it was a mere four years ago. That humble wooden box that was placed in front of the church only four years ago to help people in the community was never about us; it was God's work.

After things began to open up after COVID, it was clear that the need for help in the community was not going away. So, we moved the food pantry into the hall located next to the church. At that point, the pantry was open every other Saturday and served a few families every month. We were not in the hall long before we encountered zoning issues. Because of the zoning issues, the food pantry was relocated to the basement of the church. The hurtle of zoning and the move into the church basement did not end our work with the food ministry because it was never about us; it was God's work.

Shortly after the pantry moved into the church basement, St. Paul Penryn developed a relationship with Lititz Chooses Love, a LGBTQ+ affirming organization. With that relationship, Lititz Chooses Love's leadership and their volunteers, the food pantry grew to include a gender affirming clothing bank and grew to be open two days a week instead of twice a month! Additionally, Lititz Chooses Love established a relationship with PA Food Bank allowing us to get a huge amount of food very cheap. This all happened because it was never about us; it was God's work.

Never would we have imagined only four short years ago that the small wooden box that was placed in front of the church in Penryn would grow into a food pantry and clothing bank that serves hundreds of people every single week. That truly is God's work!
