Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks,  
and gave it for all to drink, saying:

shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin.

Remembering, therefore, his death, resurrection, and  
ascension, we await his coming in glory.

and unite the wills of all who share this heavenly food,  
the body and blood of Jesus Christ, our Lord;  
to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit,  
be all honor and glory, now and forever.

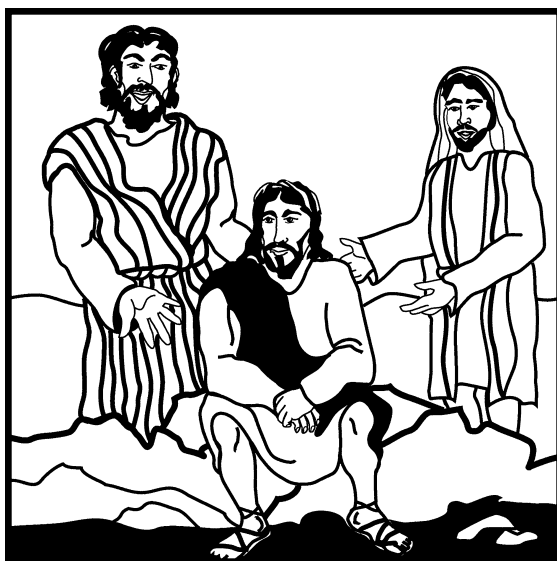

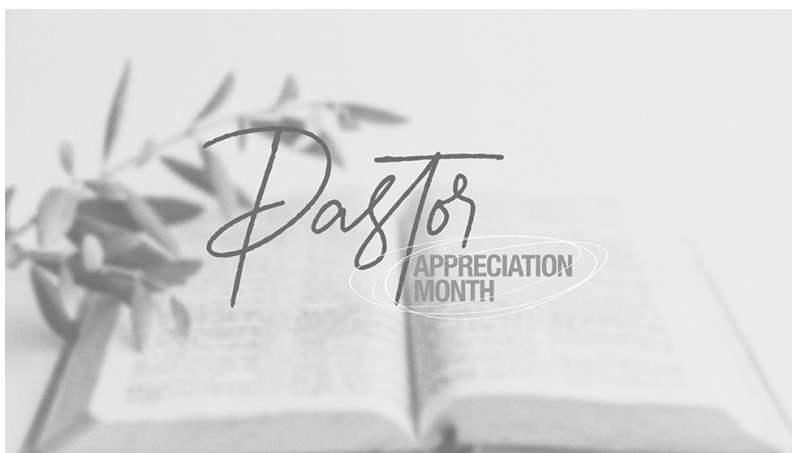

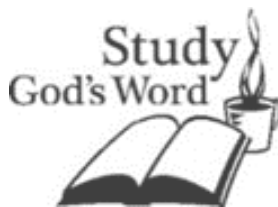
## NEWS IN OUR PEWS
