

*Prayer for our Veterans, those Serving, and the Nation

P: Let us pray for all veterans of war. O Lord, today we thank you for our veterans, for their willingness to risk all so that our nation might dwell in peace and safety. May our veterans find the honor and recognition they truly deserve. We pray that you will heal the physical, spiritual, and psychological wounds some of our veterans have suffered. Bring a lasting peace to those who mourn the loss of comrades. Help them to trust in your love and mercy, so that they may cope with the actions they may have had to take while they served our country. Help them realize that the rules of engagement in war do not always follow the laws of Christianity but give them solace by your scripture passages that show them that there are times during which, after every effort for a non-violent resolution fails, battle may be necessary for the common good. Clinging to the cross of Christ we cry out,

C: hear us Lord.

P: Let us pray for those preparing for or actively serving in war zones. You are our rock, our fortress, and our shield, and those at war need you to be all these things and more. They don't have to be in the heat of battle to be in danger; the world is a dangerous place wherever they are. Help them turn to you as their refuge and strength – always ready to help in times of trouble. Go before them and protect them from behind. Be their shade from the heat, their shelter from the storm, their hiding place. Watch over them, for you never sleep. Their lives are in your hands; may they trust in you and not be afraid. Clinging to the cross of Christ we cry out,

C: hear us Lord.

Let us pray for our country. Almighty God, you have given us this good land as our heritage. Make us always remember your generosity and constantly do your will. Bless our land with honest industry, truthful education, and an honorable way of life. Save us from violence, discord, and confusion, from pride and arrogance, and from every evil course of action. Make us who came from many nations with many different languages a united people. Give those whom we have entrusted with the authority of government the spirit of wisdom, that there might be justice and peace in our land, and the world around us. When times are prosperous, let our hearts be thankful; and in troubled times, do not let our trust in you fail. We ask all this through Jesus Christ our Lord, Prince of Peace, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, One God, both now and forever.
