## From the Food Pantry at St. Paul

As the air begins to chill and the leaves begin to turn from greens to shades of oranges, yellows, and reds, we are reminded that change is upon us. Just as the seasons are changing with exciting new beauty, the food pantry is experiencing exciting new changes as well.

The food ministry has continued to grow throughout the summer into fall. In September the pantry served 1,780 individuals. That number included 207 new individuals, 556 total households, and 66 new households.

Over the past few years through our partnership with Lititz Chooses Love, we have been able to grow and expand our food ministry and feed thousands of people with food insecurity in our community. Due to changes in the LGBTQ+ community, Lititz Chooses Love has recently found itself needed in a growing number of areas throughout the community. Between the tremendous growth of numbers of individuals utilizing the food pantry and the increased need for LCL's presence throughout the area, LCL has decided to explore a new space to establish a larger LCL food pantry and increase their presence in new areas throughout the county. We are excited for their opportunity to grow, and we are excited to continue to partner with LCL to provide safe spaces for their activities and needs to support their community.

These exciting changes for LCL have presented new opportunities for us to explore how we can best do God's work through our feeding ministry. The changes occurring with the feeding ministry will be occurring over the next few months. Our food pantry is currently still open on Wednesdays and Saturdays with LCL. When LCL secures a new location for them to expand their vision, a transition will occur. We will communicate a timeline for the changes as the details unfold.

Our food pantry will continue to provide healthy food choices for those in our community that are facing food insecurity. When the transition occurs, the food pantry will be open every Saturday morning to provide food for those in need. We recently received a \$2000 grant from the Synod Hunger Committee. This year the Synod Hunger Committee distributed approximately \$43,000 to 28 different food ministries over the synod. We were pleased and grateful to receive this \$2000 grant. In addition to the grant, we are looking for businesses in the area to partner with our food ministry for one month during the year by providing a financial contribution for food and volunteers at the pantry for one Saturday during their month. Also, we are reaching out to local youth groups to partner with our food ministry for one month during the year by holding a food drive for the pantry and volunteers from the youth group for one Saturday during their month.

In addition to these new partnerships, we are exploring partnerships with various other supports for the individuals that use the food pantry. We are exploring partnering with VITA, Volunteer Income Tax Assistance, to provide free tax services, as well as Member's 1st Federal Credit Union to provide financial education such as budgeting, building credit history, avoiding online scams, minimizing risks of identity theft and more. We are also exploring partnering with Union Community Care to provide basic medical services like screenings and childhood vaccines and with Lancaster Works to help people improve their employment status.

What an exciting time of change and opportunity for us to see where God's guidance takes our feeding ministry during this next step in our journey! Even though we are building community partnerships, the food pantry still needs your support. Consider volunteering, making a monetary donation, and above all please keep in your prayers those who use the feeding ministry, Lititz Chooses Love during their transition, and our feeding ministry during this transitional time.


## Synod News

#### Lower Susquehanna Synod 2025 Bishop's Election

In the Lower Susquehanna Synod, we equip leaders, encourage cooperation, and engage new mission, all for the sake of sharing God's love in the world; our bishop serves as the spiritual and administrative leader in this work. In June 2025, we will elect a new bishop as Bishop Dunlop wraps up his second term and steps into retirement. Electing a bishop is one of the most important responsibilities in the life of a synod. As such, it involves discernment, from the perspective of individual potential nominees and the synod as a whole. Thus, engaging in prayerful reflection and seeking the guidance of the Holy Spirit are critical aspects of the process of nomination and election.

Enclosed are two documents to help gain a better, more complete understanding of our synod's mission support and commitment throughout the LSS, and a timeline of the bishop's election.
