The Penryn Food Pantry

The summer brought much rain this year, and it also brought in more folks to the food pantry! We saw an increase in families using the pantry, currently averaging around 30 families per week. Fortunately, we also have seen an increase in volunteers to the pantry. We have many individuals from St Paul Penryn and St Luke's volunteering on a regular basis. Volunteers come together on Saturday mornings to sign in the families to the pantry, to help hand out cold food items, and to help take food to the cars of those who could use some extra help. More importantly, those volunteers who are regular faces at the pantry have begun building relationships with the families in our community coming in for food. It has been beautiful to see the relationships building, and the families using the pantry express their gratitude for both the food and the kind, warm folks volunteering. Additionally, volunteers have been generous with their time on Wednesdays when food is delivered, and it is a well-oiled machine! Between 800 and 1200 pounds of food is typically delivered. The volunteers move the food from the skids into the food room. Then they sort it and stock the shelves. Another way that volunteers have been supporting the ministry is by picking up food donations at Weis in Lititz every Friday. It's amazing how many hands come together to do behind the scenes work to provide food for those in our community facing food insecurity.

An exciting addition to our food ministry began at the end of August. Pastor Angie has been working to connect local agencies to those families utilizing the pantry to help address root causes of food insecurity. At the end of August, Members First Federal Credit Union was at the pantry on Saturday morning. They were able to answer budgeting questions, give credit counseling tips, and help set up savings and checking accounts. More local agency supports are being set up for the fall.

As the numbers of families using the pantry increase, the need for food also increases. In August, St Luke's and St Paul Penryn collected hygiene and paper products. If you were not able to participate but would like to, it's not too late! We are always in need of paper towels, toilet paper, shampoo and conditioner, toothpaste and toothbrushes, deodorant, soap, diapers, dish soap, and laundry detergent.

Finally, I would like to share a couple of quotes from individuals that used the pantry this summer.

"Not only do they provide food and other essentials in a very loving and gracious manner, they make everyone feel welcome. They treat everyone like friends, not like they are giving handouts."

"This makes it possible for me to pay my electric bill and not have to worry there won't be money for food. A great big thank you to all of them."

St. Luke Food Ministry

Here at St. Luke, we originally got connected in 2011 with TEFAP, an acronym for The Emergency Food Assistance Program, a federal program. TEFAAP involved the distribution of groceries on a monthly basis to qualified recipients, under the auspices of Lebanon County Christian Ministries. This was spearheaded by Kit and Lori Ahnert, who are the heroes of getting this started and were involved through the end of last year, when it was discontinued. (But Kit and Lori remain as team leaders for the one of the Sunday night meals.)

At about the same time, there was a Thursday noon free meal being served by the Heidelberg churches over at Zion Methodist, but looking for a new home. Thus the Thursday noon meals were moved from Zion to St. Luke in 2013, where they continue to be staffed by members of the six participating Heidelberg Township churches on an ongoing basis.

St. Luke launched its Sunday night meal program in 2014. This program is not needs-based; the meal is open to any and all who are looking for a hot meal and community fellowship, and while many of the folks who attend are senior citizens, there are families with children who attend too. The program operates under the umbrella of Lebanon County Christian Ministries, and we follow their rules and guidelines for ordering and handling of food and supplies.

At the time we started the Sunday meals, many of us thought there couldn't possibly be enough volunteers, resources, etc., to maintain this program. Yet, here we are, more than 10 years later, still going strong despite having to curtail the program during the COVID years.

While there is a routine involved in scheduling, ordering supplies, and preparing a meal, most of the volunteers involved would tell you that it is an enlightening experience in many ways. Filling a need in the community comes to mind most often. Seeing firsthand that basic needs like food are so vital in bringing people together is another important contribution to the area.

Many of the guests at the Sunday meals develop relationships where they look out for each other, and it is such a blessing to see them care for one another!

The fellowship that is exhibited among the guests reinforces the strong need for a community gathering like this, and what better place to do it but a church social hall?

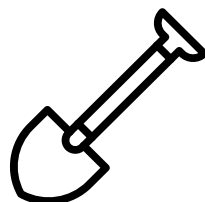
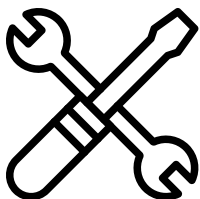
KONDE DIOCESE: IWAMBI ORPHANAGE: BUILDING EFFORT

On June 7, 2025, the Rev. Stephen Robert Herr was called to serve a six-year term as bishop of the Lower Susquehanna Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). Rev. Herr currently serves as pastor of Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. Ordained on July 2, 1994, Pastor Herr has served in parish, campus, and synodical leadership for more than three decades.

His service includes roles on the ELCA Church Council, Executive Committee, and multiple synod councils, as well as leadership in outdoor ministry, ecumenical engagement, the arts, and historical preservation in the Gettysburg area.

THE ELCA ELECTS NEW BISHOP

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America elected its first Black leader on Wednesday (July 30) at its churchwide assembly meeting in Phoenix. The Rev. Yehiel Curry, bishop of the ELCA's Metropolitan Chicago Synod since 2019, will serve a six-year term as the denomination's presiding bishop, the top leadership role.
